

Are There Many Roads to God?

Presumably, the speaker included Catholicism as one of the many roads to God. That being the case, we should hear what Jesus has to say on the subject.

In John 14:6 Jesus says: “**I am the way**, and the truth, and the life; **no one comes to the Father but by me.**” So, Jesus clearly says that He is the only way to the Father. He also said: “Enter through the narrow gate; for the gate is wide and the road broad that leads to destruction, and those who enter through it are many. How narrow the gate and constricted the road that leads to life. And those who find it are few” (Matthew 7:13-14). Jesus said: “**the road** that leads to life.” He is clearly saying there is only one road to eternal life and thus, God.

Reject the words of Jesus and you reject Jesus. And if you reject Jesus, you reject the one who sent him (Luke 10:16). And that would be God the Father. And, that is why Peter says: “There is no salvation through anyone else, nor is there any other name under heaven given to the human race by which we are to be saved” (Acts 4:12).
